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The *Journal of Historical Linguistics* aims to publish papers dealing with any language or language family as far as they make a significant contribution to the theory or methodology of the field of historical linguistics. In principle, all papers should have a diachronic orientation. Papers published in the journal are expected to present more than a repetition of previous studies extended to another dataset, but, e.g., bring new perspectives, refine existing methodologies or challenge current views on general issues based on careful analysis of the extant historical data. Regarding methodology there is a need to extend methods and approaches well developed within linguistic typology to historical linguistics, as there is still a major gap between these two fields. This does not only mean that historical linguistics could profit from the contribution of linguistic typology, but also the contrary. Thus, contributions on diachronic typology, which combine methods from both fields, would be most welcome.

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
